

Revere Athletic Hall of Fame

The Revere Athletic Hall of Fame will recognize and honor outstanding achievements of teams, individuals, coaches and contributors who have helped create and carry on an excellent athletic tradition at Revere. The other intent of this award is for our inductees to serve as a model and motivation to our current and future athletes

- Athletic Hall of Fame Committee
 - The general function of the committee is to govern and administer this organization within the guidelines set forth by the Revere School Board.
 - The Athletic Hall of Fame Committee shall establish policies and procedures necessary for the proper functioning of the Revere High School Athletic Hall of Fame.
 - The Athletic Hall of Fame Committee will consist of between 7-10 members who must be present at the selection meeting to discuss and vote on potential Athletic Hall of Fame nominees.
 - The Athletic Director shall serve as chairperson of the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee or shall appoint a member of the committee to serve as the chairperson.
 - The High School Principal and the Athletic Director shall appoint members to the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee. The members will serve three year terms and may be reappointed at the discretion of the AD.
 - Membership on the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee will be non-elected and as follows:
 - Athletic Director—Chair
 - Principal
 - Revere Local School Board President or appointed member
 - Teacher or appointed member
 - Coach of a Male Sport (Maximum: 2)
 - Coach of a Female Sport (Maximum: 2)
 - Revere All-Sports Booster Club President or appointed member
 - Member of the Revere Athletic Hall of Fame (after first year)
 - **If any member of the committee becomes nominated, he/she will be asked to reclude themselves from the process until their nomination is no longer valid (5-years) or until they are inducted.**
- Criteria for Nomination: The following criteria should be considered when evaluating the nominees, **they are not necessarily requirements.**
 - Team
 - It must be at least seven (7) years from last competition date.
 - Exceptional team achievements—this may be defined as undefeated seasons, league championships, district championships, regional championships, and state tournament appearances/championships, etc.
 - Teams must have had school varsity status during the season for which they are being nominated.
 - No more than one team in any year may be selected and the committee may choose not to select any team.
 - Athlete
 - Graduated from Revere High School at least seven (7) years ago.
 - Demonstrated high degree of skill and performance: Earned an MVP award in a selected sport, was voted to an all-state team or an all-conference team.
 - Competed on a Suburban League Championship team.
 - Was a statistical leader or record holder in a selected sport.

- Competed in a state tournament as an individual or was on a team that qualified for state competition.
- Earned a letter in more than one sport and/or earned multiple letters in a single sport.
- Acknowledged for outstanding examples of character, courage, leadership, and sportsmanship in school and out of school.
- Distinguished Alumnus at Collegiate Level
 - Graduated from Revere High School at least seven (7) years ago and participated at the college/university level.
 - Demonstrated high degree of skill and performance: Earned an MVP award in a selected sport, was voted to an all-American or an all-conference team.
 - Competed on a conference or league championship team.
 - Was a statistical leader or record holder in a selected sport.
 - Competed in a national tournament as an individual or was on a team that qualified for national competition.
 - Earned a letter in more than one sport and/or earned multiple letters in a single sport.
 - Acknowledged for outstanding examples of character, courage, leadership, and sportsmanship in school and out of school.
- Distinguished Alumnus at National/Professional Level
 - Graduated from Revere High School at least seven (7) years ago and participates or participated at the national or professional level.
 - National/professional level: Olympics, National Competition (non-university affiliated competition), selected for profession sports league (selected/drafted), participation in profession sports league/competition.
 - By making it to this level, the athlete demonstrates or demonstrated a high degree of skill and performance.
- Coach
 - A coach of Revere High school that is retired, has not coached in seven (7) years, or currently coaches but is age 65 or over.
 - Had a minimum winning percentage of 50%.
 - Earned a conference, region, state, and/or national coaching award.
 - Coached a team or individual in state competition.
 - Was instrumental in building a successful athletic program.
 - Coached a team that won a Suburban League Championship.
 - Contributed toward promoting sound educational values in his/her student-athletes.
 - Acknowledged for outstanding examples of character, courage, leadership, and sportsmanship.
- Special Contributor
 - A contributor (manager, trainer, doctor, booster club member, parent volunteer, or other individuals who contributed significantly to the athletic program).
 - Was a major influence in the lives of Revere athletes by example and/or contribution.
 - Acknowledged for outstanding examples of character, courage, leadership, and sportsmanship.
- Combination
 - A combination of athlete, coach, distinguished alumni, and/or contributor of Revere High School athletics.
 - Demonstrated any combination of the above criteria.

- Election Process
 - Nomination Form would needed to be completely filled out and submitted.
 - Anyone may submit a completed nomination form to the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee for consideration. All nominations will remain on file for five (5) years from the last nomination and after that time must be re-nominated.
 - All nominations must be on file by April 30. The people who are nominating individuals shall inform the individual of his/her nomination and shall be responsible for gathering information on the nominee's past achievements.
 - The Athletic Hall of Fame will have a maximum of twelve (12) inductees its first three years and subsequent years it will have a maximum of six (6) inductees.
 - To ensure that older nominees get proper recognition, one inductee must be either deceased or 65 years old or older (if a nomination form for such a person has been submitted and is on file).
 - The selection committee reserves the right to select ONE Coach-Team-Special Contributor each year outside of the maximum six (6) inductee limit.
 - The selection committee reserves the right to select s Special Contributor from the special contributor nomination list (which may be different or in addition to the HOF nomination list). The committee also reserves the right to select a Special Contributor outside of the regular HOF voting procedure and to not have this selection count towards the maximum number of inductees in any given year.
 - All nominations will be reviewed and voted on by the Hall of Fame Committee. The committee may discuss and take a hand or ballot vote through their discussions. If a consensus cannot be reached, the committee will vote according to the following point system:
 - Committee members will cast a vote for ten nominees (10 points for 1st choice and 1 point for 10th choice).
 - Nominees must receive at least 30 points for induction.
 - If no nominee of 65 years or older (or deceased) receives the minimum vote, the top voter gainer automatically receives entry (as long as the nominee's accomplishments are at the level of the expected criteria). If none received votes, these nominees will be voted on specifically with the top vote getter gaining entry.
 - If more nominees than the maximum achieve 30 points, then the top nominees (12 in first three years, top six thereafter) will receive induction.
 - If not enough nominees receive 30 points, then the top fifteen nominees will be voted on in the same manner. If the minimum inductees have not been met, then the top ten nominees will be voted on in the same manner. If the minimum inductees have not been met, then the top nominees (eight in first three years and four thereafter) will received induction.
 - Inductions are made during halftime of the first home football game—typically the Alumni Football Game (game in which the Revere Alumni Association hosts an All-Class Reunion).
 - One plaque for the entire induction class will be made and displayed in the Revere High School Athletic Hall of Fame (wall across from the trophy case). Another individual 8x10 plaque will be presented to the inductee—plaque will include picture of the inductee, name of inductee, sport(s) participated in, and brief list of accomplishments. And a vinyl banner listing the induction class (with their graduation and category of induction listed) to be hung in the stadium.
- Timetable:
 - Distribute Nomination Forms year-round
 - Collect information on nominees year-round
 - Deadline for nominations to be considered for following fall is April 30
 - HOF Selection Committee Meets & selects and notifies inductees—May
 - Complete information for plaque and media—June
 - Order plaques and awards—July
 - Announce award winners to media—July
 - Awards presentation first home football game—August/September
