Cleveland was still a boom town in the 1920s. Much of this progress was tied to the building of the Terminal Tower by the Van Sweringen brothers. The brothers saw a future in rail shipping and made certain that Cleveland was positioned to benefit from the building of a big, new terminal that welcomed commerce and personal travel. The complex, now known as Tower City Center, was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1976. Please join us for this free program which is open to the public.
