RECOMMENDATIONS TO REDUCE POTENTIAL EXPOSURE TO KNOWN ALLERGENS

Food Allergies - Please List:

- Notify staff of allergy - including substitutes.
- Parent will send alternative snacks/treats.
- Request parents of students in class refrain from sending snacks/treats containing allergen.
- Provide cleaned peanut/nut-free table.
- Encourage handwashing. Hand sanitizers do not fully remove allergens.
- Parent will provide lunch from home.
- Parent will have student wear emergency alert bracelet/medal.
- Encourage that teachers consult with nurse regarding food ingredients used in classroom activities.
- Increase awareness of anaphylaxis symptoms.
- Train staff in use of medications indicated on the Emergency Health Care Action Plan.
- Inform classmates of allergy.
- Parent supplying additional epinephrine auto-injector stored in student's backpack for transportation use.
(Must be accompanied by a physician's order that the student can carry his/her own epinephrine.)

Bee Sting Allergy

- Notify staff of bee sting allergy - including substitutes.
- Parent have student wear emergency alert bracelet/medal.
- Increase awareness of anaphylaxis symptoms.
- Train staff in use of medications indicated on the Emergency Health Care Action Plan.
- Parent supplying additional epinephrine auto-injector stored in student's backpack for transportation use.
(Must be accompanied by a physician's order that the student can carry his/her own epinephrine.)

Latex Allergy

- Notify staff of latex allergy - including substitutes.
- Have vinyl gloves available in case of emergency.
- Eliminate balloons in immediate area.
- Parent have student wear emergency alert bracelet/medal.
- Encourage teachers consult with nurse regarding materials potentially containing latex.
- Increase awareness of anaphylaxis symptoms.
- Train staff in use of medications indicated on the Emergency Health Care Action Plan.
